

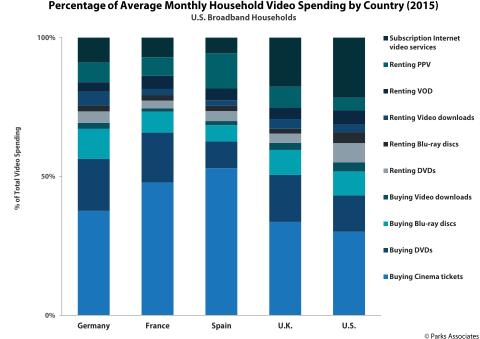
Content Strategies: Survival in the New Video World **Table of Contents**
